

Welcome to the UCR Labor Summer 2025 Student Fellow Application Guide

Thank you for your interest in being a Labor Summer 2025 fellow. Established in 2022 and hosted by the Inland Empire Labor & Community Center at UCR (IELCC), the UCR Labor Summer Fellowship program provides emerging student leaders with hands-on leadership development and training through fellowship placements with labor unions and community organizations advancing worker justice in the Inland Empire region.

Selected students are awarded \$7,360 in recognition of their participation in the program. Students receive leadership and professional development training, a certificate of completion, and access to a UC statewide labor summer network.

Who is admitted into the Labor Summer fellowship?

Labor Summer 2025 is open to all UCR upper-division standing undergraduate students regardless of their immigration status. Current UCR undergraduate seniors graduating in Spring 2025 are welcome to apply along with continuing undergraduate students in upper-division standing. We welcome various types of leadership styles and value the diversity of roles that make social justice movements possible.

If you aspire to be an organizer, policy advocate, lawyer, artist, grant writer, researcher, photographer, communications strategist, public speaker, or writer, or have any other skills that you would like to utilize to advance a social justice movement, this program is for you. This is a competitive opportunity, so we recommend you put time and care into your application in order to be considered.

Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission, you must be:

- At least 18 years old by June 16, 2025
- A current UCR student who has not previously participated in Labor Summer
- Commitment to labor rights and social justice
- Available to work full-time from June 16 to August 8, 2025
- Available for in-person programming and work in the Inland Empire from June 16 to August 8, 2025
- Able to submit the online application form by **11:59 PM PST on February 7th, 2025**

***Note:** Potential host organizations will have the opportunity to view your submitted responses to the prompts and resume.

Prompt A: Why are you applying to Labor Summer? How does participating in Labor Summer align with your leadership and professional goals? (3,000 characters max)

Prompt B: How have labor rights issues affected you personally, your family, community, loved ones, etc.? How have your identities impacted your life experiences and shaped who you are? Examples of what to consider: young worker, immigration status, gender, class, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, ability, religion, nontraditional student, or anything else that you believe contributes to who you are. (3,000 characters max)

Prompt C: Select one social justice issue that is impacting working class communities. What is your analysis of this issue? What do you view as your role in addressing it? (3,000 characters max)
